




Summary of research



- case studies
 - ISO 37105: Descriptive framework for cities and communities
 - ISO 37106: Guidance on establishing smart city operating models for sustainable communities
 - ISO 37120: Indicators for city services and quality of life
- research methods
 - 51 semi-structured interviews
 - document analysis
- location of research

Key findings



- city standards are not like shipping container standards
 - represent a range of opinions on urban infrastructure, governance, sustainability and information technology
- what the standards hope to achieve
 - facilitate inter-city communication and knowledge exchange
 - integrate urban systems and data generated about them
 - make city data internationally comparable
 - spread tools and techniques for managing cities
- based on three ideal organisational forms
 - systems
 - markets
 - networks

Key lessons



- get involved in making standards
 - National Standards Authority of Ireland (NSAI)
 - ISO/TC 268: Sustainable Cities and Communities
 - mirror committee
- how to engage with city standards
 - think in terms of open systems rather than closed systems
 - question the logic of silo busting
 - question the commissioner model of service provision
 - do not be afraid to insist on local sovereignty over data and metadata
 - global indicators are not a replacement for local, geographically sensitive analysis
