








## Summary of research


Problem: Smart City been criticized because too technocratic and top-down

Solution: 'citizen-centric' smart city (ex. EIP-SCC €365 million in 2013)

## Key lessons

- → Activate governance which rests on a framework of civic and social rights
- → Mobilize resources for truly felt issues rather than for technology's sake
- → Slot projects towards 'meaningful' form of citizen participation
- → Use our scaffold for evaluating smart city initiatives from the perspective of the citizen (e.g., How are citizens being considered in the project? In which role or at which stage?)
- → "To whom am I accountable? Can you get rid of me?"
- (e.g., Have the citizens a say in the planning of the project deliverables and, if so, can they change the project outcome after funding been allocated?)
