

Key findings

Prototyping future at:

- Commercial hackathons: innovation competition; building start-up economy; showcasing R&D capacities; leading to precarious urban life
- Civic hackathons: technology building to society's benefits; inter-team collaboration; real problems
- Civic hacking: longer-term approach; relation and capacity development; solutions indicating problems;
- **Diversity initiatives**: right to participate; 'widening the door' for participants, knowledge and expertise; lacks resources




Key lessons

- Capacity of the public to propose and prototype social innovation
- Expanded scope of funding or sponsorships for diversity initiatives and social innovation to ensure the right to the future city
- Open-ended, rather than target meeting, explorations to enhance civic and governmental collaboration
- Social entrepreneurs as an added pathway to encourage innovations and entrepreneurships that are grounded in better understandings of urban issues
